# Weekend Archeology Camp

AS A RESULT OF THE SUCCESS OF ACHA'S ANNUAL ARCHEOLOGY CAMP, the Programming and Education Committee decided to hold an archeology camp geared to adults. On May 15th and 16th, ACHA trustee and professional archeologist Matt Kirk led an excavation of the site of the former Ten Broeck burial ground.

When Abraham Ten Broeck had a bur-



ial vault built on the Prospect estate, he naturally assumed that many generations of Ten Broecks would find their eternal rest here. In actual fact, the estate was sold less than 20 years after the Ten Broecks first moved in and by 1850 the vault was no longer in existence and the remains had been relocated.

In 1835, the foundation of the burial vault was undermined due to the grading of Lumber Street (now Livingston Avenue). The vault collapsed and the remains were moved, eventually being re-interred at the Albany Rural Cemetery

Among those believed to have been originally buried in the Ten Broeck Vault are Abraham and Elizabeth Ten Broeck, their daughter Margaret, two Ten Broeck grandchildren, the Reverand William Lynn, and General Philip Schuyler.

The Albany County Historical Asso-

ciation owns the lot on which the burial vault once stood, so we were able to offer the opportunity to our members and others interested in historical investigation to dig on the site. Although the original foundation was not discovered during the camp, participants did find some interesting artifacts, including an old coin and carved wooden balls.

# Living History Day
